# SENIOR YEAR CHECKLIST,

### September

- Set up a meeting with your college advisor to discuss post high school options
- Visit college and/or trade school campuses
- Verify your school choices offer your desired field of interest
- Apply to 3 colleges or trade schools
- · Sign up for the ACT
- Make a list of deadlines for financial aid, housing, known scholarships, etc.
- Ask teachers, coaches, etc. for recommendation letters
- Check the scholarship spreadsheet for fall scholarships and deadlines

## December-January

- Apply for housing and pay deposit (if you have decided on a college)
- Continue to monitor the scholarship spreadsheet and fill out scholarships as they open (if you already have your recommendation letters by now, that should save you some time/effort)
- Continue to check the scholarship spreadsheet regularly

## April-May

- Send graduation announcements to family and friends
- Register for college summer orientation
- Make a list of all important dates orientation, move-in dates, etc.
- Apply for a summer job
- Request transcripts from any colleges in which you were enrolled for dual credit during high school (visit the college's registrar page to request transcripts
- Graduation is May 17

#### October-November

- take the ACT
- Fill out FAFSA (the application opens on October 1)
- Have ACT scores sent to the colleges in which you are most interested
- Attend Senior Information Night at SJCS
- In October, you will have a composite senior picture taken at Sics
- Ask teachers, coaches, etc. for recommendation letters
- In November, attend Senior meeting to order cap/gowns, etc.
- If you have decided on a college, look to see when housing opens and write it down on your calendar
- Look into college ministries and churches near your top college choices - ask for references from people you trust
- Continue to check the scholarship spreadsheet regularly

## Februray March

- Men 18 and over must register for the Selective Service in order to receive federal financial aid and A+ funds
- Check your email frequently to check on correspondence from colleges, FAFSA, your college counselor, and scholarship committees
- Continue to check the scholarship spreadsheet regularly

#### Summer

- Continue to monitor your email for important dates, events for freshmen, etc.
- Prepare for freshman orientation by looking ahead at which classes you may want to take your first
- Make sure you know what dual credit classes you took and pay attention to how they transferred to your college of choice
- Hug your parents, be nice to your siblings, and save money

Please note that you are young adults, and I expect you to be responsible and communicative.
